

# *He is Risen, He is Risen Indeed!*

## **Monday**

How many times have we heard the phrase "He is risen"? But can we truly comprehend the magnitude of love that caused Him to suffer so that we could be free? Or the miraculous wonder of conquering sin and death? Re-read Mark 16 and pray for God to fill your heart with wonder and amazement in His grace and love.

## **Tuesday**

We have spent this Lenten season asking God to "search us". While this can be a difficult process, He does not show us our sin so that we can carry it around and feel guilt, He wants us to give it to Him. Read Romans 6:5-14 and pray that God will show us how to let go of our sins and really live for Him.

## **Wednesday**

As we let go of sin and give ourselves back to God, He wants us to see ourselves through His eyes. Read 1 John 3:1 and imagine all of the words that describe a newborn baby: precious, beautiful, a miracle.....and ask God to help you claim these words for yourself. We have not outgrown being a precious miracle to God.

## **Thursday**

As we are still basking in the miracle of Easter, letting go of old messages and listening to the truth that God loves us more than we can comprehend. Read Hebrews 12:1-3 and pray that God will help you "run with perseverance the race marked out for you".

## **Friday**

Read Jeremiah 29:11-14: God's plan is to prosper us; to give us hope and a future. I recently heard this quote: "Everything will be alright in the end, and if it's not alright, then it's not yet the end." If things don't feel alright in your life right now, then trust and remember, "it's not yet the end".

## **Saturday**

In preparation for tomorrow's sermon, Read Genesis 3 and ask God to open your heart to His calling for you.
